Minnesota Pastor Upheld in Refusal To Give Up Pulpit

New Tim, Minn., Jan. 1931—
District Judge B. M. Heitzen Monday backed up a Springfield, Minn., pastor who was fired and refused to give up his pulpit.

Heitzen said the Zion Evangelical Lutheran Church had no right to discharge the Rev. Walker R. Buhl at a meeting Aug. 1922, and enjoined the church from proceeding with action in Springfield municipal court to remove the pastor from the parsonage.

The judge ruled the church can fire its pastor, but that the advice calling the meeting did not convey the impression such a subject would be brought up.

The Zion Church is a member of the Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod. A difference of opinion over doctrinal matters arose between the Rev. Mr. Buhl and some members of his congregation.

Of 60 voting members in the congregation, 35 attended the meeting. Sixteen sided with the pastor in the long court action that split the congregation and led to separate services.

The church, a corporation, and nine members of the congregation were listed as defendants in the trial held in District Court here Aug. 11, 1923. The decision was delayed intentionally to give the disputing parties time to resolve their differences.
